American commercial interests in Guyana.

The recent subcommittee hearings which produced the allegations were held at the insistence of Ryan's successor, Republican Congressman Bill Royer.

Most of the charges came from Ryan's administrative assistant, Joe Holsinger — who asked dramatically during the Feb. 20th

session: "Was Leo Ryan set up for murder?"

Other charges came that day from Jacqueline Speier, Ryan's legislative counsel — who accompanied him to Guyana and was wounded in the airport ambush which took Ryan's life.

Both charged the State Department failed to adequately warn Ryan of the dangers at Jonestown, and had not protected Americans held there against their will by the Rev. Jim Jones.
